REGISTERING IN THE COMMUNE

After moving to Zell, you have 14 days to register at the residents' register office. You must also apply for a residence permit within this period if you do not already have one.

CHILDCARE IN DAYCARE CENTRES

Daycare centres (Kitas) are childcare facilities for children of pre-school age. Childcare is provided by trained staff from Monday to Friday during fixed opening hours. Daycare centres provide relief to parents, enabling them to work or complete training or further education, for example. The children have the opportunity to spend time with their peers, discovering the world together and acquiring important social and language skills.

MONEY, SOCIAL INSURANCE AND TAXES

MONEY

In Switzerland, it is customary to deposit money in an account. Various accounts are available from banks as well as Swiss Post. Comparing financial institutions is worthwhile due to varying interest rates and fees.

SOCIAL INSURANCE

Compulsory social insurance protects the Swiss population against certain risks and provides an economic safety net. With the exception of health insurance, it is deducted directly from salaries.

Social insurance is divided into five areas:

- Old-age, survivors’ and invalidity insurance
- Health and accident insurance
- Loss of earnings compensation during military/civilian service, maternity and paternity
- Unemployment insurance
- Family allowances

TAXES

Everyone who resides in Switzerland, works here and/or stays here is liable to pay tax. Those without a permanent settlement permit or who are not married to a person with Swiss citizenship or a permanent settlement permit or who live in a registered partnership are subject to withholding tax. In this case, taxes are deducted directly from the salary.

PRENATAL CLASSES IN YOUR LANGUAGE

Pregnancy involves a lot of changes. By attending a prenatal course, you receive information and counselling on pregnancy, birth, breastfeeding and the first few weeks and months at home with your child. The programme is available in many different languages.



COMPULSORY HEALTH INSURANCE

Everyone living in Switzerland must have health insurance. If you are moving to Switzerland from abroad, you have three months to take out a health insurance policy. The benefits of compulsory basic insurance are all regulated in the same way by law, but due to the price differences it is worth comparing or switching to another insurer at a later date.

Besides compulsory basic insurance, you can take out various supplementary insurance policies with the same or another provider. These offer additional cover for hospitalisation, glasses or dental care, for example.

MOTHER AND FATHER COUNSELLING

The mother and father counselling service of the child and youth welfare centre (KJZ) visits the community and provides free and confidential advice. The service answers your questions about the development, care, breastfeeding, nutrition and raising of your infant and supports you in your new chapter of family life.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Practically anywhere in the Canton of Zurich can be reached by train or bus. Children up to the age of six travel free of charge, and children and young people up to the age of 16 pay only half the fare. There are many low-priced tickets such as the children's travelcard, the half-fare travelcard or supersaver tickets. Information on tickets, discounts or season travelcards can be obtained from the Zurich Transport Network ZVV (www.zvv.ch) or the Swiss Federal Railways (www.sbb.ch).

CAR

If you already have a driving licence, you have 12 months to convert it into a Swiss driving licence. The application should be sent to the driver and vehicle licensing office of the Canton of Zurich.

With the exception of motorways, you can use the roads in Switzerland free of charge. A vignette is required to use the motorways. The adhesive vignette is available at petrol stations, post office counters and customs offices along the border. The vignette is also available in electronic form at www.e-vignette.ch.

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LANGUAGE

LIBRARIES

In order to become successfully integrated in Switzerland, you need to be able to speak German in any situation. Going to a library promotes reading skills and expands vocabulary. The Commune of Zell does not have its own library. Visiting a neighbouring commune is therefore recommended. Borrowing media is free of charge for children up to the age of 16.

LIVING

WASTE DISPOSAL / RECYCLING

Disposal does not mean the end of the line: many materials can be recycled. The aim is to make waste management more environmentally friendly. You can find information about the different types of waste and how to dispose of them using the QR code.



RESPECTFUL NOISE LEVELS

There are rules for promoting coexistence among neighbours and within the community. These are set out in the police regulations. Any disturbance of night-time peace between 10.00 p.m. and 7.00 a.m. is prohibited. Noisy work is permitted on weekdays from 7.00 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1.00 p.m. to 8.00 p.m., and on Saturdays from 8.00 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. Outdoor events that result in noise after 10 p.m. require official approval.

TV, TELEPHONE AND INTERNET

In Switzerland, there are various TV, Internet and telephone providers. It is worthwhile comparing them. The availability of their offers varies depending on the apartment or house.

A radio and television licence fee is payable throughout Switzerland for any devices in your home (including smartphones and laptops) that can receive electronic media. The company Serafe (www.serafe.ch) is responsible for collecting this fee.

INSURANCE

Home contents and personal liability insurance is not compulsory, but it is recommended. Home contents insurance covers the costs of damage to your possessions at home or when travelling, for example due to glass breakage, theft or water. Personal liability insurance pays for damage to property or persons. You are free to choose a policy from any insurance company, but it is a good idea to compare quotes due to the price differences.

DISCOUNTS

SECOND-HAND SHOPS

You can find a wide range of furniture, clothes, household items, books and toys in a second-hand shop ("Brocki"). The products available are second-hand items in good condition. There are a large number of second-hand shops in the Canton of Zurich. You can find an overview via the QR code.



HOLIDAYS

Family holidays or holiday camps for children often put a strain on a family's budget. Families on low incomes should still be able to travel somewhere on holiday. Kovive offers holiday camps for children and young people. The costs depend on the parents' income. Reka holiday assistance makes a week's family holiday possible for 200 Swiss francs.

The KulturLegi is a personalised pass that gives you discounts of up to 70% on over 4,200 cultural, educational, sports and health offers. You also get access to the Caritas market, where you can buy food on a tight budget. The nearest Caritas market is in Winterthur.
